Six-Week English Language and American Culture Program
National Formosa University
July 5-August 12, 2011
(March 9, 2011)
The Center for English as a Second Language, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, proposes a six-week program of English language instruction for students of National Formosa University. The program would consist of 20-25 hours* per week of intensive English language instruction, emphasizing listening and speaking skills as well as the other language skills of reading, writing, grammar, and pronunciation. Additional study opportunities exist in our Language Media Center on an individualized basis, though students in the lower levels may work with their classes in the Language Media Center. Local nature and cultural excursions and social recreational activities will also be included.
(*The number of hours varies, depending on the level in which each student studies.)

## Budget

Below please find the proposed budget for our intensive English language program and for the other instructional and basic living costs for 10 or more participants.

Students will be tested upon arrival and placed into the appropriate level of our regular intensive English courses for six weeks. This price waives the application fee of $\$ 50.00$ and discounts the cost of regular tuition. This price includes the TOEFL exam, some course materials, fees for activities and trips, welcoming and graduation activities/ ceremonies. Students will need to purchase one or more books for their classes, depending on their level of placement.

## Recreation Center

Students will have full access to our world class Recreation Center and to the beach on Campus Lake.

Health Service Fee, approximate, per participant
This is at the university rate of $\$ 5.38$ per person per day for 42 days. This coverage
entitles students to medical assistance at our on-campus Health Service Clinic. It also covers emergency care at the hospital if the Health Service sends the student there.

Transportation to and from the St. Louis Airport, cost per participant $\mathbf{\$ 1 2 0 . 0 0}$ We will arrange for transportation from the airport to Carbondale. We will also arrange for transportation back to the airport.

## Special Group Activities

CESL sets up many activities for our visiting groups: Sightseeing trips to St. Louis and to several local scenic areas, local wineries and restaurants, baseball game, boating, and a final banquet. This fee will cover some of the costs of providing special activities for students from NFU.

## Dining Services

If the group chooses to live in one of the off-campus dormitories, the students may want to cook for themselves in the large cooking area provided. If the group is going to live in one of the on-campus dorms, we will purchase a Debit Dawg card for the amount determined by National Formosa for meals per day. This card may be used at restaurants in the Student Center as well as a number of local restaurants. If the card is desired, approximately $\$ 12.00-\$ 15.00$ per day can be allowed for meals ( $\mathbf{\$ 5 0 4 . 0 0} \mathbf{-} \mathbf{6 3 0 . 0 0}$ )

Dining option in the Student Center: The Student Center has a number of dining options, including a cafeteria and several popular chain restaurants: McDonald's, Chick-Fil-A, Blimpie's, Starbucks, and others. There is a nice dining room on the second floor with a soup and salad bar and special hot entrees every day.

If NFU chooses off-campus housing, we recommend that students buy their own food to cook in the dorm this year. This option gives students the most choices and will probably save them a considerable amount of money.

## Housing: Two options

A. Students can be housed in one of our on-campus dormitories (double-occupancy). The housing rates for summer 2011 are $\$ 23.50$ per day. Bed linens and towels will be provided. There is free Internet for students. If this option is chosen, please note that accompanying faculty will also have to pay for housing.

B. Students can be housed in an off-campus dormitory (single-occupancy) located one block from campus. Bedding, towels and washcloths are included. Free Internet access is also included.
